Reflection "Christ Our Universal King"	Prayer for "Jubilee Year of Mercy"	For the housebound and our sick brothers and sisters:

<p>Today the last Sunday of the Church's year, we honour christ as our King. This entails helping to spread His kingdom; we should do this collectively, as the church, and as individuals, in our daily lives. Moreover, in our Baptism we share in Christ's Kingship. Our Lord was nailed to His cross with the words over His head, "Jesus of Nazareth, the King of the Jews."</p> <p>Was this recognition or ridicule by Pilate? He was jeered by the soldiers, "If you are the King of the Jews, save yourself." Previously, He had had to flee to the hills when the crowd tried to make Him king by force.</p> <p>The kingdom of God is clearly different from the secular State. It has nothing to do with power, domination or coercion; it is not based on race, tribe or self-interest. Rather, it has to do with promoting love and truth, and is concerned with justice and peace. Cardinal Hume wrote that in understanding and working for the kingdom of God, we need to keep four aspects in mind.</p> <p>"The kingdom of God is present now; it is at the same time a future reality. It is internal to the hearts and minds of the Baptised; it is at the same time an external reality in the world. To emphasise one aspect and neglect the others can lead us badly astray. It can give a distorted view of the role of the Church."</p>	<p>Lord Jesus Christ, you have taught us to be merciful like the heavenly Father, and have told us that whoever sees you sees Him. Show us your face and we will be saved. Your loving gaze freed Zacchaeus and Matthew from being enslaved by money; the adulteress and Magdalene from seeking happiness only in created things, made Peter weep after his betrayal, and assured Paradise to the repentant thief. Let us hear, as if addressed to each one of us, the words that you spoke to the Samaritan woman: "If you knew the gift of God!" You are the visible face of the invisible Father, of the God who manifests his power above all by forgiveness and mercy; let the Church be your visible face in the world, its Lord risen and glorified. You willed that your ministers would also be clothed in weakness in order that they may feel compassion for those in ignorance and error: let everyone who approaches them feel sought after, loved, and forgiven by God. Send your Spirit and consecrate every one of us with its anointing, so that the Jubilee of Mercy may be a year of grace from the Lord, and your Church, with renewed enthusiasm, may bring good news to the poor, proclaim liberty to captives and the oppressed and restore sight to the blind.
