The Holy Trinity.

Today we celebrate the solemnity of the Holy Trinity, the feast of the Triune God manifested in three persons, The Father, Son and the Spirit.

In our practice of Christian Life, the Trinity is remembered often in prayer and during the daily routine by every Christian.

Each time we make the sign of the cross, as we do at the beginning of every Mass, we say: "In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit."

The feast of the Most Holy Trinity is a mystery and a mystery is precisely something that one does not fully understand. This does not mean that we are unable to express anything at all concerning this reality; on the contrary, we are able, thanks to what Jesus told us, to describe this mystery a little and to grasp it through comparisons and images. Our faith tells us that these three persons are indeed distinct and yet together. And that God is closely associated with the human kind that he sent his Son and also he sent his own Spirit.



St. Augustine of Hippo on the "Blessed Trinity".

The story is told of St. Augustine of Hippo, a great philosopher and theologian who wanted so much to understand the doctrine of the Trinity and to be able to explain it logically. One day as he was walking along the sea shore and reflecting on this, he suddenly saw a little child all alone on the shore. The child made a hole in the sand, ran to the sea with a little cup, filled her cup, came and poured it into the hole she had made in the sand. Back and forth she went to the sea, filled her cup and came and poured it into the hole. Augustine went up to her and said, "Little child, what are you doing?" and she replied, "I am trying to empty the sea into this hole." How do you think," Augustine asked her, "That you can empty this immense sea into this tiny hole and with this tiny cup?" To which she replied, "And you, how do you suppose that with this your small head you can comprehend this immensity of God?" With that the child disappeared.
